

SHELL AND BAR SCARF

Crochet Design by Karen Klemp

Scarf Size: 6 ¼” x 80”.

Materials: Jojoland Ballad No. 428 (or other fingering or sock weight yarn) 4 balls at 220 yards per ball (total yardage 880 yards).

Size G-6 (4 mm) hook.

Gauge: Work first few row of scarf. It should measure 6 ¼” across. If it is significantly larger, change to a smaller hook; or if it is much smaller, switch to a larger hook.

Stitches Used: Shell = 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc in same place.

Shell in Shell = work shell in the ch-1 space of shell in previous row.

FPDC: Front post double crochet = working around post of stitch indicated, yo, insert hook from front right to back to front left around post, yo and pull up loop (there should be 3 loops on hook), yo and pull through 2 loops, yo and pull through 2 loops, finishing the stitch.

BPDC: Back post double crochet = working around post of stitch indicated, yo, insert hook from back right to front to back left of post, yo and pull up a loop (there should be 3 loops on hook), yo and pull through 2 loops, yo and pull through 2 loops, finishing stitch.

Chain 45

Row 1: (RS) DC in 2nd ch from hook and in ea of next 2 chains, *sk 3 chains, in next ch work shell (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc); sk 3 chains, dc in ea of next 3 chs; rep from * across, ending with dc in last 3 chs. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, DC in 1st st, FPDC around post of next st, BPDC around post of following st, *shell in next shell; BPDC in next st, FPDC in next st, BPDC in next st, rep from *; finish last 3 sts by working BPDC in 1st one, FPDC in next, and DC in last st. Turn.



Row 3: Ch 1, DC in 1st st, BPDC in next st, FPDC in following st, *shell in next shell, FPDC in next st, BPDC in next st, FPDC in next st; rep from * across, ending with last 3 sts as follows: FPDC, BPDC, DC. Turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, DC in 1st st, FPDC in next st, BPDC in following st, *shell in next shell, BPDC in next st, FPDC in next st, BPDC in next st; rep from * across; end with last 3 sts as follows: BPDC, FPDC, DC. Turn.

Repeat Rows 3 and 4 until 2 balls of yarn are finished.

Turn scarf around so that beginning chain is on top, with RS facing (note, if you crochet right-handed, tail of yarn will be on your right; if you crochet left-handed, tail of yarn will be on your left. Attach yarn with a slip stitch, ch 1. Then work along the bottom of beginning chain, following instructions for Rows 1 through 4 above, and repeat Rows 3 and 4 until second side of scarf matches first.

If you don't block your scarf, it will have a look almost like seersucker. If you want it to be a flatter, smoother product with the shells clearly visible as shells, you may block it by washing or wetting it, stretching it out a bit and letting it dry flat.
